

What is PBIS?

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a research-based proactive systems approach to establishing the behavioral supports and social culture needed for all students at North Muskegon Elementary to achieve social, emotional, and academic success. At NME this involves:

- Clearly defining and teaching behavioral expectations.
- Consistently acknowledging expected behavior.
- Providing clear and consistent interventions when students do not meet expectations.
- Using behavioral data to assess progress and address needs.

Why PBIS?

- Reduction in problem behavior
- Increased academic performance
- Improved social-emotional competence
- Reduction in bullying behavior
- Improved perception of safety
- Increased positive school climate and culture
