On-Line Resources

Grades and Credit/No Credit:

- HS Grading = Students have the option of keeping the grade they had when the shutdown began, work with their teacher to advance the grade they had at the start of the shutdown or move to Credit/No Credit as desired (Your student will receive a survey to assist them in deciding which option they/you would prefer. Please work with your student to choose the option that fits their needs the best.)
- MS Grading = Feedback and tracking, the best we possibly can, to know where kids are performing within each essential standard.
- Elem Grading = Feedback and tracking, the best we possibly can, to know where kids are performing within each essential standard.
- Insufficient Evidence was added to MS/HS Scales to show standards/tests that were not touched.
- This can always be changed in the future.
- Per Governors EO, a student's grade can not drop over this time.

Food Distribution: Our NM Food Distribution Site occurs every Wednesday from 10am - Noon and is available for ALL students 18 years old and younger. Please pull behind school on Moulton and look for the smiling faces ready to assist! We are averaging over 200 students per week (that's just under 3,000 meals per week) - thanks Food Service Staff!



OK2Say: Students who wish to confidentially report any concerns during the mandated shutdown, are welcome to utilize <u>OK2Say</u>.

"Last Day of School" - Yes, we will have a "last day of school" when we are allowed to do so. This will be a day of celebration! None of us are sure of the date, but it will happen. We all (students, staff, families and the community) need this! More to come!

Summer Learning Opportunities: We will have a Summer Educational Program. At this time, this program will be for ALL students that choose to make use of this opportunity. Details are currently being worked out - more to come!

Calendar for 2020/21: As everyone is aware, there are MANY questions that need some level of answers before we can possibly have a "solid" plan for next school year's calendar. At the time the shutdown was enacted, the district was involved in calendar negotiations with the Teacher's Union. In some ways, it is a blessing with all of the currently unanswered questions that we had not finalized a calendar back in March. We continue to work through the development of next year's calendar while keeping an eye on information relative to our physical distancing requirements and the plan for potential easing over time of our restrictions. It is quite likely that our school calendar will need to look different than in the past. Please watch for calendar updates coming soon as more information is learned - we know everyone is anxious to have this information.

You have our commitment, NM School Community, that we (NMPS Staff) will do everything in our power to provide your/our kids the skills needed to advance.
