

# How to benefit from TIP Scholarships

#### What is TIP?

The Tuition Incentive Program (TIP) is a state program that pays for the first two years of college...for eligible students.

## How do I know if I qualify?

If you answer yes to all four of these questions then you are eligible for the Tuition Incentive Program:

- Have you ever been on Medicaid for 24 months within a 36 consecutive month period?
- 2. Will you have obtained a high school diploma or GED by age 20?
- 3. Are you a Michigan Resident?
- 4. Are you a U.S. citizen?

### Will I be notified?

- Students can be identified as TIP eligible as early as the 6th grade or when they are 12-years-old.
- The Department of Treasury will notify you about your eligibility via a letter. It is important to KEEP THAT LETTER.

#### Steps to Take BEFORE High School Graduation



- 1. Talk to your
  counselor about the TIP. Your school
  counselor can help you:

  ✓ determine your eligibility
  ✓ apply for TIP, and
- Fill out the application form and mail it in.

inform the school of your choice

- KEEP THE LETTER you will receive from the Department of Treasury detailing your eligibility
- You MUST notify the state that you are interested in utilizing your TIP scholarship by calling 1-888-447-2687.
- You MUST send/fax the letter of credit to the college you plan to attend.

#### Phase 1

## Once in College, Phase 1 Begins

TIP will cover tuition and mandatory fee charges but...

- You must enroll in an associates degree program.
- You must be enrolled at least half time (6 credit hours or more).
- If you receive additional financial aid, you may need to be full-time (at least 12 credit hours). Contact the college or university's financial aid office for details.

#### Phase 2

## While in College—Phase 2 begins:

It will provide a maximum of \$500 per semester up to a maximum of \$2,000 total tuition assistance for credits earned in a four-year program.

- When you complete an associate degree you will need to transfer into Phase 2 of the TIP Scholarship.
- In order to successfully transfer to Phase 2 you must contact the State of Michigan for a letter of credit for Phase 2. This needs to be done the semester before Phase 1 ends.
- You can call the State of Michigan toll free at 1-888-447-2687.
- You then must send the Phase 2 letter of credit to your college or university.
